6. Additional funds appropriation

- The \$1,000 that was used on the holiday radio promotion in 2021 will be used to increase Social Media advertising for the holiday season. An allotment will be decided upon as we get closer to the holiday season, but an estimated amount of \$500 was discussed
- We also have an estimated \$1,000 ear marked for our digital marketing consultant as a remainder of the TIFF funds received in 2021
