What is Elevate Maine/Somerset?


Elevate Maine/Somerset is a partnership between the Maine Early Learning Investment Group (MELIG) and Educare Central Maine (ECM).

Project Goals:

- Elevate the quality of instructional practices in both Center-Based settings and Family Childcare homes.
- 2. Enhance family engagement and parent education to support their child's learning and development.
- Provide comprehensive child and family services including nutritional, oral, mental, and physical health.
- 4. Gather data and analyze child-parent-family progress and provider/teacher quality improvement.
- Expand local and statewide awareness of the importance of quality early care and education.

The *Elevate Maine/Somerset* mission is to ensure that program participants arrive at school healthy and ready to succeed.

Service Area



With the highest number of child risk factors in the state, the greater Skowhegan area and Somerset county have been selected as Elevate Maine/Somerset's premiere location (2015).

Child Outcomes

113* children have participated in the Elevate Maine/Somerset evaluation

Initial data indicates increases in initiative, self-regulation, and/or attachment/relationships demonstrating reduced negative behaviors and positive social/emotional well-being; children with disabilities are closing the gap toward age appropriate scores of their typically developing peers; and children grew in all domains, meeting 5 of 6 in just six months.

Supporting Families

Family engagement is a cornerstone of the success of this Project. Focusing on the whole child means involving the family and meeting children's health needs as well as supporting child development and early learning.

- Weekly Provider visits for coaching/mentoring
- Enhanced funding for environments, resources, and supplies
- Parent engagement and education
- Professional learning communities and networking with other providers
- Program evaluation to gather data and support increased child outcomes


Investing in Early Education and Care

The cumulative lifetime fiscal savings and tax benefit to government is estimated to be **4.8 times greater** than the initial cost.*

Provider Outcomes



The FCCERS-R scale assesses family childcare programs on a variety of items, including physical space, materials and activities offered, and interactions. Elevate Maine/ Somerset Providers have increased the overall average score since the beginning of the Project, with more notable gains in the areas of 'Activities' and 'Listening and Talking'.

Elevate Maine/Somerset is an on-the-ground, rural, replicable model in the greater Skowhegan area that demonstrates a coordinated birth-to-kindergarten-entry quality early care and education system.

It is a strategic public/private partnership with rural family childcare and center-based programs designed to elevate instructional practices; increase family engagement; provide comprehensive services (nutrition, oral, mental and physical health education and resources), utilizing evidence-based evaluation to measure progress and attainment of quality benchmarks for children, families and early educators.

The Elevate Maine/Somerset project goal is to fundamentally change Maine's early childhood education delivery system by demonstrating the impact of investing in high quality early childhood education from birth.
