130th Legislative Session – Step-by-Step Directions to Testify for a Bill

(in Writing or via Zoom) Updated 11 Feb 2021

First, go to the online portal here: https://www.mainelegislature.org/testimony/

You'll need to know the Committee, the date of the public hearing, and the Bill Number (LD). Select each of those at the top of the form.

Then fill out the rest of the details on this page. If you want to testify in person, you should check that box on the bottom of the screen first (see red arrow - there seems to be a glitch that if you upload written testimony first, that will be deleted when the in-person box is checked and must then be uploaded again). Note also that you will need to click Support/Oppose/Neither For Nor Against. Seasonal residents should use their Maine town, even if they don't vote in Maine. Click Submit/Register.

If you are testifying "live", you will get an email from the Committee clerk with a Zoom link to use at the date and time of the hearing. You will also get a reminder an hour before the meeting. You will not have audio or video enabled when you first join the meeting. When it comes time to hear testimony, the chair will read out three names at a time, and you will be let into the meeting and your audio and video can be turned on. Please note it takes 5-7 seconds to "join" the hearing. Be patient through this transition! Committee Chairs have discretion when it comes to your background and will request you turn off your video if you have a background deemed offensive. You will have three minutes to speak. Greet the two chairs by name and the

- Testimony received after the day of the public hearing will be distributed to committee members and staff, but it may not be published online;
- Testimony will be published as soon as possible after the day of the hearing;
- Your name and the organization you represent or the town in which you live, as specified by you on this form, will accompany the publishing of your testimony;
- Please include your name and organization or town of residence on any documents;
