Automatic Renewals - How They Work

Auto renewals are a one time automatic action. Eligible items renew for the original loan period. For example, books renew for an additional 3 weeks and DVDs for an additional week. Borrowers will continue to receive a courtesy reminder notice 3 days *before* an item's due date. The auto renewal notice is automatically sent *on* the due date. Be sure to check the status of *each* item in the renewal notice. Items that automatically renewed will show a status of "Loan Renewed" and no further action is needed. Otherwise, the status will show "Not Renewed" and the item is due back to the library. Items that are not eligible for renewal are those on hold for another patron and new items (those with a "New" label on the spine). You may return your items at any time on or before the new due date to avoid late fines.

Orchid Care Tutorial Monday, Oct. 16, 6:30-7:15 p.m.

Join us for a live orchid repotting demo by orchid enthusiast, Ellen Icart. You will learn how to assess an orchid's condition and some best practices for orchid care including planting material, fertilizer, and watering. This program focuses on phalaenopsis orchids, aka moth orchids, which are typically sold in grocery and box stores. If you have a moth orchid, bring it with you for an assessment and if time permits, receive assistance

Stop in the library and register your little one and start them on the path to reading - a proven way to support future academics.





