Citizen's Institute of Rural Design

• Connecticut's Countryside decided not to apply for the Citizen's Institute Program Grant. The time was too small to create an adequate application, since the applications are due on April 21st. This grant would have had a team of planners to come in and create a plan to address a pressing issue for a rural community. However, since Connecticut's Countryside is made up of four rural communities, finding an issue that would impact all four of us would be difficult. As such Connecticut's Countryside will not be applying this year for the Citizen's Institute of Rural Design.

Chamber Update

- Veteran and foundation center (located in Willimantic)
 - O It is meant to help veterans dealing with Agent Orange. This will provide compensation and VA coverage, which will impact on the 4 towns. The 4-towns have a lot of veterans living here, so it impacts a large portion of our communities. Each town has a community representative; the towns will need to coordinate with these representatives to ensure veterans are aware of local services.
 - Towns can work with the Windham Chamber of Commerce and the veteran
 foundation center to help educate our veterans on their options and services.

 Chamber of Commerce is a regional organization and works with all four of the
 towns.
