1. As it relates to the qualified opinion on the aggregate remaining fund information and the adverse opinion on aggregate discretely presented component units, why does the auditor's report state the financials do not present fairly? Was this unique to 2022 or has this been consistent over the years?

Because it is missing the component part. This is not unique to 2022 this has been on the finance statements since 2012.

2. The report refers to an entity determined to be a component of the Town that is not included in the financial statements. What is this component unit? Is it the Fire Department? Why are the assets/liabilities and operations excluded?

Yes, the missing component unit is the Fire Department. These assets, liabilities and operations are excluded because the Fire Department will not provide the information to the auditor.

3. Page 77 refers to 4 significant deficiencies in internal control. Some of these don't appear that significant to me, but regardless - do we have a plan to have these remediated before this year-end or will these remain open for this year? Would value your views. Anything the Committee can do to support here?

We hope to have all the findings corrected by the end of this year.
