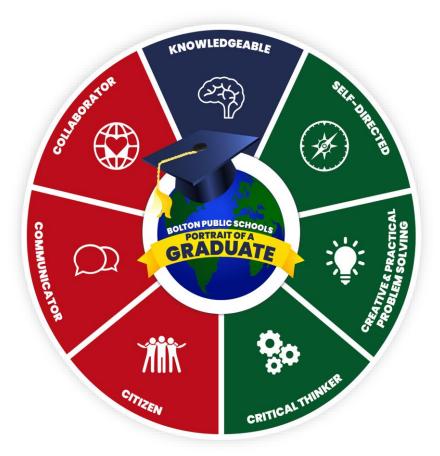

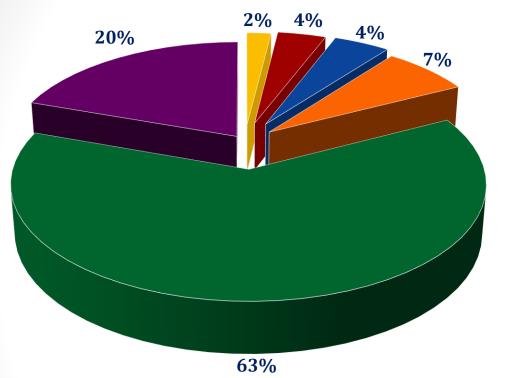

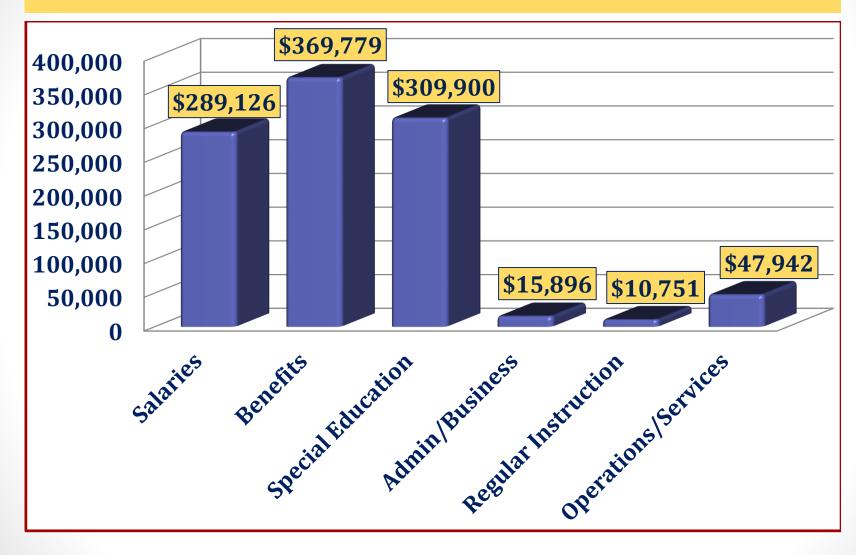
Overview of Expenditure Plan FY24

Impact of Inflation

- Regional inflation was 6.1% for 2022
- Proposed increase for 2023-2024 is 6.88%
- Proposed increase adjusted for inflation is a 0.78% increase
- The Board of Education's approved budgets have not kept pace with inflation over the last 10 years
- The FY 23 Board of Education budget is about 9% below what it would have been if our budgets had kept pace with inflation
- Consumer Price Index (CPI) Inflation Calculator
 BOE FY13 budget of \$12.86 million dollars has the same buying power as \$16.66 million dollars in December 2022
 - □ This is \$1.3 million dollars higher than our current FY23 budget
 - This is \$397,940 higher than our proposed FY24 budget of \$16.2 million dollars

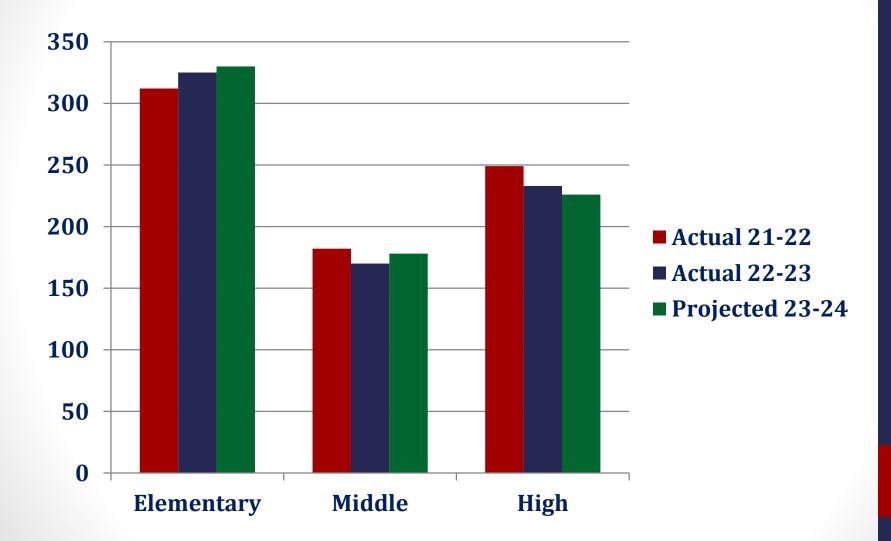
