To all:

Based on my discussion with Jim Rupert, I believe it is premature to request the initial bonding. Below is s summary of our discussion:

- TBC has been proceeding as if we needed to get the project done as close to the spring delivery date as possible. This may not be necessary.
- The BOS has not decided on whether Town will be keeping the old truck that the new is replacing. This could affect the size and schedule of the expansion.
- Bonding is very expensive, and the BOS are looking to do a larger bonding package that includes the Firehouse,
 Notch Road Demolition and several other projects. In my opinion, multiple rounds of bonding for the same project, due to the cost of preparing the bond (large volumes of paperwork and attorney costs) will get rejected.
- Bonding may get delayed as they want to package the school roof in. There is legislation at the state level that may offset some of the roof project costs.
- Maintenance costs of the firehouse are included in the normal budget. It makes sense to include the roof into this project but need to determine the costs related to each. Other maintenance, like the exterior brick are also an issue that needs further discussion.
- We could invite the BOS to our meeting, which could help but we would likely only get a few to show up and they could not speak for the BOS.
- Attendance at the BOS with our question and point of discussion was suggested.
- The Truck is scheduled for delivery next spring but the time of this project will likely be contingent on getting the bonding and other projects.

I will attend the next BOS meeting to pose some of the questions and look for further guidance. Plan on making a list for discussion with BOS.

In addition to the items below I suggest:

- 1. Bonding schedule... how long does it take, do you need hard numbers for the bonding amounts?, how are changes in cost handled?
- 2. What is the plan for the old truck?
- 3. If the town keeps it, where will they store it? Cold storage versus a heated space if building is not ready before new truck arrives?
- 4. How do we determine what is acceptable to the BOS? Second floor, added storage, code review / upgrade / renovation of existing, maintenance work.?

Any thoughts are welcome. Please be advised that all correspondence will be part of public record.

Jim,

We had a productive meeting last Tuesday. I offer the following:

- 1. We will be making recommendations to the BOS:
 - a. Firehouse expansion will proceed as Design Build as this is the only method that can even come close to completion by the time the new truck arrives.
 - b. We are preparing a formal letter to the BOS to start the Bonding for the Firehouse project. The money needs to be in place as soon as possible. Increases and decreases can be made later. Very rough estimates (see attached):
 - i. 1 story = \$700,000
 - ii. 2 Story = \$1,500,000
 - iii. Renovation of existing = \$1,100,000
 - iv. Total initial bonding should be at least \$1 million
 - c. A 2 step process to select the DB Team is planned:
 - i. Step 1: A draft "Letter of Interest" Solicitation will be prepare very soon. This will need to be advertised as soon as we can to generate interest from DB Teams. The solicitation will request Qualifications of the DB Team, including but not limited to:
 - 1. Architect, Engineer(s) and Contractor Qualifications
 - 2. Design and Construction Schedule
 - ii. Step2: Proposals from the Short Listed DB Teams. This will include:
 - 1. Details on proposal build: basic plan view, elevation view, anticipated materials, etcetera
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 - 5. Schedule
 - 6. Other information
- 2. It is customary and usual to offer a stipend to the short-listed teams(usually 3) to cover some of the costs of preparing the Proposal. The architect / engineer will be preparing concept plans / drawings details and other work. Is the town willing / able to provide stipends?
- 3. We have started looking around for consultant assistance with preparation of the DB solicitations. This is necessary to provide level of details to the shortlisted DB teams. Any suggestions from you, BOS, BOF or others is welcome.
- 4. With the expansion, are we required to do any improvements / code upgrades to the existing?
- 5. Are there any State / Federal Grants to offset some costs?
- 6. We need the original firehouse drawings and any survey information as soon as possible. They need to be scanned so we can provide with Letter of Interest solicitation.
- 7. Is there someone in the Town that can assist with the drafting of the LOI solicitation?
- 8. We have concurred on the 2nd Tuesday of the month for our regular meetings. Can you notify the appropriate persons?

Please let me know if you have any questions. I would be available to discuss with you and the Selectman if necessary.
