

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The Bolton Diversity Commission is proposing the distribution of two town sponsored surveys to serve as part of community assessments as it relates to strengths and opportunities for improvement around diversity, equity and inclusion in the town of Bolton.

One of the surveys would be targeted to youth, aged 12-17 while the other survey would be intended for those 18 and older. The surveys are intended for those who currently live and/or work, or go to school in Bolton as well as prior residents. The survey does collect demographic information from respondents but does not require the submission of any identifying information such as name, address, date of birth, email of phone (though respondents can choose to provide them if they wish to be contacted to provide further information). Following analysis of the responses, only aggregate data will be shared without any identifying information but may be grouped by demographic identifications.

With the blessing and support of the Board of Selectman the distribution plan proposal is as follows.

The surveys will be distributed via Google Forms, with versions available in English and Spanish. Hardcopy surveys will also be distributed strategically around town at sites to include the below with drop off boxes at all sites for completed surveys.

- Bentley Library
- Town Hall
- Senior Center

These surveys will ultimately be manually entered into the Google Form by one or two Diversity Commission members with the hardcopies retained for the record.

Flyers will also be posted at these sites with QR codes that will take people directly to the appropriate survey link. Additionally, private businesses will be approached to ask if flyers can be posted at their sites for more comprehensive coverage.

The links will be posted on town social media sites including Facebook, Instagram and Twitter accounts relevant to the town. The link will also be distributed in one or more Bolton Bulletins.

The intent is to get as many respondents from as many diverse backgrounds as possible.

For the youth survey, the hope is that parents of children residing in town will let their children know about the option to complete the youth specific version of the survey. The Diversity Commission will conduct outreach to the Superintendent and Board of Ed to see if the Link and or a paper version can be distributed to students and their families via the Backpack Program with a message from the Board of Selectman indicating their support for the survey.

The currently timeline allows for a two month distribution and collection period from mid-March to mid-May, with analysis hopefully completed to bring to the July or August Board of Selectman meeting with identification of trends, important insights and recommendations for next steps from the Diversity Commission members.
