A. Farm Maintenance report

Three bids for the potable water hydrant grant have been received. All three bids came in with similar prices. John will make calls in the next few days to findout the avaiability of each contractor. This avaiability will determine who will get the job.

E. Digging into History Event July 2023

Arlene has spoken with Christine Pittsley regarding advertising information. Kevin Drake agreed to help with publicity for this event. French students are coming to Connecticut for two weeks in July for an archeological dig at the Farm. Christine is looking for a logo for the Farm. The Bolton Heritage Farm Commission has adopted the Town of Bolton's 300th Anniversary logo, which mainly features the barn. Kevin will contact Patrice regarding the steering committee for the Connecticut Countryside group, as their website is being finalized. Each of the four towns has an economic representative as its voice.

Christine would also like the French students to do a community service project while they are stateside. Arlene inquired with John. There will be approximately 30 students total. Beth got permission to use the church for a cooking competition, which is an event for the students only. The French students will cook dinner for the American students and vice-versa. The students will be staying at CCSU. Christine is bringing tables and chairs to the Farm for the students use and asked if they can be stored in the barn overnight. John confirmed the town will need an insurance rider for the property stored in the barn.

F. Living History Weekend October 7 & 8 2023

We will start marketing the event and choosing media. Patrick Carroll and Arlene will meet in April after it rains so he can formulate a plan A and B in regards to potential wet weather. Bonnie will follow up with the Women's Auxiliary. We need to find out if the church has any events occurring that weekend. If not we will need them to hold their space and offer a down payment for the space for the night of Saturday, October 7.

Kevin advised that the "Good to Great" grants are for large sums. Next on our list for grants is to find one for design for the toilet facilities. After the design grant we will need a building grant for the structure. The working blueprints, which will be a part of the design grant, come first.
