On Monday, March 30, we began offering limited borrowing service to BOLTON RESIDENTS ONLY with a valid library card (see below to obtain or renew a card). Please be aware this is at your own risk; we cannot guarantee that items are virus-free.

#### CHECKOUT:

Patrons may request material by calling us at **860-646-7349** during the hours of 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Thursday, or by e-mailing <u>bentley@biblio.org</u> or placing a hold through our online catalog at <u>bentley.biblio.org</u>. Limits will be placed on NEW items – two new DVDs and two new books – but for older items our normal policy will apply. Let us pick out some seasonal children's books for you, such as Easter, Passover, spring and Earth Day, or some titles for students still working on the "Reading Hall of Fame" program.

We will contact you when materials are ready, to arrange a pick up time, at which time your items will be placed in a bin outside for you to pick up. Please respect social distancing and do not congregate at the front door. Any items not picked up by 5:00 p.m. will be brought into the building until the next day.

**LIBRARY CARDS:** We will renew expired cards or issue new cards with an expiration date of June 30, 2020, so that patrons can check out material and access online resources.

#### **RETURN:**

The book drop is open for returns, but we are using a new procedure to keep library staff as safe as possible. Items will be in quarantine off-site for a minimum of four days before being checked in. This means returned items may still appear on your account after you return them. Do not be alarmed! We will not charge late fees on any circulating items, and there will continue to be a grace period after the library returns to normal services.

### THE FUTURE:

As you can appreciate, the current health crisis means that everything can change overnight. We are constantly monitoring the COVID-19 situation and re-evaluating our response.
