Curbside scrap metal collection will be held the week of May 2-6, 2022. Items for collection must be curbside by 6 a.m. on Monday, May 2^{ND} . If your items are not collected by Friday afternoon, please call the Selectmen's office the following Monday. Noncombustible appliances and other metal items weighing up to 100 pounds are

acceptable. Refrigerators and freezers should have the doors removed. **Unacceptable** items include motor vehicle parts, machinery, gas grill propane tanks and items weighing more than 100 pounds. Please remember this collection is for scrap metal only, not for bulk waste.

NEWS FROM THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE ELDERLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED TAX RELIEF

Elderly and totally disabled tax relief program applications must be filed with the Assessor's Office between February 1 and May 13, 2022.

The State of Connecticut Program, and a matching local program, are available to residents of Bolton who:

- · Have attained the age of 65 on or before December 31, 2019 or be totally disabled as defined by Social Security guidelines.
- · Reside at the property for a minimum of 6 months plus one day. Only a primary residence is eligible for the program.
- · Received a total income not exceeding \$38,100 for a single person or \$46,400 for a married couple last year. This includes taxable as well as nontaxable income.

The programs allow a credit on the July tax bill.

Those persons who are already on the programs but are due to renew this year will be mailed reminders that they must refile.

Applications can be filed at the Assessor's Office, Town Hall, 222 Bolton Center Rd., during Town Hall hours.

Proof of income, including Social Security 1099 forms are required; if an income tax return is filed or will be filed, a copy must be presented.

Income based programs allowing increased exemption benefits are also available to veterans and applications for eligible taxpayers will be taken at the same time as the elderly relief programs.

NOTE:

A new local option program has been implemented, in addition to the above programs. The new program allows an eligible person to "freeze" their property taxes at last year's amount, but income (married must be less than \$75,000; single must be less than \$50,000) and age (over 70 years of age) limits apply, and a lien is placed on the property by the Town in the amount of the abated taxes.

Please see below for frequently asked questions and the best ways to pay your tax bill.

Finding out what you paid in calendar year 2021 is as easy as going online using the link above. Search your name (last name (space) first initial) click the IRS Button IRS Payment Records for Year 2021. On the blue tab above your accounts click again on IRS and then click on View IRS. It will come up with a printable statement with your account information. You will need to put the first initial in separate for each person you are looking for.

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Delinquent Motor Vehicle bills have been reported to the DMV and it will be necessary to have all accounts paid to be able to register a vehicle. Please make sure you pay your taxes at least 2 weeks before you need to register your vehicle to make sure you have no compliance issues. You can check DMV's online services under compliance issues to ensure you are clear before you go to DMV. If you need clearance before the 2 week period of time then you will need to make your payment online with a credit card or in the Tax Collector's office with cash, money order, or certified check as well as let me know that clearance is needed, so that I can do a manual take off for you.

An online payment does not automatically release a DMV hold at the time of payment.

#### **Payment Options:**

Option 1: Online- Save time and pay from home and receive your receipt of payment directly to your email.

You may pay by credit card or electronic check over the internet. A nominal fee will be charged by our vendor, Invoice Cloud and is non-refundable.

Online payments will take 3-5 days to process. The account will not show as paid online until after this processing time. Please make sure you receive a confirmation to your email that shows your payment is starting to process.

Please make sure you enter the correct account number and routing number so that the transaction does not get returned. Additional fees will be added to any payment that is returned unpaid.

Please go to the tax collector's door to the left of Town Hall. Press the button to the left of the door to be let in.

On Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>, meet at the Bolton Commuter at 10:00 AM (Rt 6/44 across from Georgina's Pizza).

Hike to beautiful Freja Park and enjoy the Sixth Annual Fairy House Building Contest followed by an Ephemeral Wildflower Walk led by Leslie Alexander concluding with a tree planting and Freja park volunteer recognition.

Join an Entry Level Fairy House Building Workshop and win a prize for the most uniquely built Fairy House! Adults, boys, and girls of all ages are invited to build miniature shelters. Bring your imagination, creativity, and love of nature to Freja Park.

Led by Leslie Alexander, participants on the Wildflower Walk will search out and identify Freja Park ephemeral wildflowers, the perennials which flower in spring, then go dormant by mid-summer. 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
