## FROM THE OFFICE OF THE ASSESSOR

## **ELIGIBILITY FOR BASIC VETERANS EXEMPTION IN BOLTON**

The state-mandated veteran's property tax exemption is available to state residents who are veterans of the U. S. Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, and Air Force and any reserve component of these branches, including the Connecticut National Guard performing duty under Title 32 of federal law).

To be eligible for a 4,500 assessment reduction on a resident's real estate or motor vehicle bill:

The veteran is <u>REQUIRED</u> to record an honorable discharge (typically an original copy of your DD-214 or a certified copy thereof) with the Town Clerk. Veterans with an other than honorable discharge (but not a dishonorable discharge) with a *qualifying condition* are also eligible (see below).

In the absence of a copy of the DD-214, there are provisions in state statutes for the veteran or relative to appear before the assessor for an examination under oath. Do not send a copy of your DD-214 to the Assessor's Office. The Assessor's Office cannot record it for you.

1) There is no cost to do this but it has to be done prior to the next October 1 to receive the exemption. To receive an exemption on the 2023 Grand List (billing will be done July 1, 2024), the DD-214 must be recorded prior to October 1, 2023. If you do not have your DD-214, one can be requested at <a href="http://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records/">http://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records/</a>.

A "qualifying condition" for an other than honorable discharge means (A) a diagnosis of post-traumatic stress disorder or traumatic brain injury made by an individual licensed to provide health care services at a United States Department of Veterans Affairs facility, (B) an experience of military sexual trauma, as described in 38 USC 1720D, as amended from time to time, disclosed to an individual licensed to provide health care services at a United States Department of Veterans Affairs facility,

- or (C) a determination that sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression was more likely than not the primary reason for an other than honorable discharge, as determined in accordance with subsections (c) and (d) of this section (CT General Statutes Section 27-103).
- 2) The veteran must have served in a time of war at least ninety cumulative days except, if the period of war lasted less than ninety days, "service in time of war" means service for the entire period of war, unless separated from service earlier because of a service-connected disability rated by the Veterans' Administration, during a period of war shown in the Table below.

Homeowner's Program for the Low Income Elderly and Totally Disabled The Assessor's Office is accepting NEW and RENEWAL applications for the homeowner program for the low income elderly and totally disabled through May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023. This program is income based. The maximum income limit for a single person is \$40,300 and for a married couple it is \$49,100. A copy of a current (2022) income tax return must be presented at the time of application if one is filed with the IRS, along with statements of any untaxable income such as Social

Security or Railroad Retirement payments. If an income tax return is not filed, statements of all income must be presented. These include statements of wages, lottery winnings, taxable pensions, IRA's, interest, dividends, rental income, Social Security SSA1099, Railroad retirement, veteran's payments, etc.

This is a two year program, with refile applications every other year. **Taxpayers** who were approved last year do NOT NEED TO REFILE THIS YEAR, unless your income is lower and you are eligible for a higher exemption amount.

## Income and Expense Forms

Income and Expense Forms will be mailed to owners of rental property in Bolton by April 15, 2023. They are due back in the Assessor's Office by June 1, 2023. To assess your rental property equitably during the 2023 revaluation, information regarding your property's income and expenses is required. Connecticut General Statute (CGS) 12-63c requires all owners of rental real property to file this report annually. The information filed will remain confidential, is not open to public inspection and is not a public record under the Connecticut Freedom of Information statute (CGS 1-19).

If a property owner receives a form, you must return it by June 1, 2023 to avoid a penalty that increases the property's assessment by 10% for one year. The only reason an owner may not be required to file is if the owner resides in the 1-6 family residential property. There is an option on the form if this applies

## **REVALUATION**

2023 is a revaluation year for the Town of Bolton. CT General Statute 12-62 requires the revaluation of all real estate in town every five years. The last revaluation in Bolton was for the 10/1/2018 Grand List. The 2023 values will be used to determine taxes payable in the summer of 2024.

The town has contracted with Vision Government Solutions, Inc. (VGSI) in Hudson, Massachusetts, to work with the Assessor's Office on revaluation. Vision data collectors and appraisers will be frequent visitors to town in the over the next year, starting in March 2023.

All Vision employees will be wearing an identification badge and will have written documentation from the town stating their affiliation with the project. Homeowners are encouraged to ask for this identification before answering questions or admitting an inspector to their homes. The Assessor's Office, Town Administrator's Office and State Police will be provided with information on the employees and their vehicles.

There are five major phases to a municipal revaluation: Data Collection, Market Analysis, Valuation, Field Review, and Informal Hearings. For more information click here.

Delinquent Motor Vehicle bills have been reported to the DMV and it will be necessary to have all accounts paid to be able to register a vehicle. Please make sure you pay your taxes at least 2 weeks before you need to register your vehicle to make sure you have no compliance issues. You can check DMV's online services under compliance issues to ensure you are clear before you go to DMV. If you need clearance before the 2 week period of time then you will need to make your payment online with a credit card or at the office with cash or money order as well as let me know that clearance is needed.


