Knox Box Safety Program

A Knox Box provides local first responders with quick and safe entry to a home during a medical or fire emergency without property damage. The device is fastened to a door and does not require permanent adhesion so it is available for both homeowners and renters.

We have a limited number of Knox Boxes available. They were purchased by Bolton Senior Inc. with grant funding from the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving Bolton Community Fund. If you would like to participate in this safety program, please contact the Senior Center office for an application.

AARP Community Challenge

AARP

We are happy to announce that we are a 2022 AARP Community Challenge grant recipient. There were 3200 grant submissions nationwide and we were one of the 260 projects selected. We are honored to join Farmington and Stratford as the three projects in Connecticut!

The purpose of this grant funding is to revitalize an under-utilized outdoor space. We know from the pandemic just how key it can be to have access to outdoor spaces. The Town of Bolton, along with the Bolton Senior Inc. (through grant funding from the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving Bolton Community Fund), has invested in a new set of patio furniture to replace our 25 year old set. We are also fixing up the surrounding patio area to offer additional recreational opportunities, including gardening, outdoor games, and relaxation under our awning. The grant funding will create a pickle ball court and spectator area for use between the pickle ball court and the bocce courts. In shade and in sun – Bolton Seniors are ready to have some fun! Stay tuned for additional construction this fall and we will enjoy the final touches next spring!

ENERGY ASSISTANCE

We are expecting fuel costs to be high this winter. We strongly encourage you to apply for energy assistance through ACCESS Community Action Agency at 860-450-7400. Income limits are \$39,791 single, \$51,996 couple (ask for additional household sizes).

HOLIDAY PROGRAM REGISTRATION

Do you need help with food or gifts this holiday season? Registration for the 2022-2023 Social Services Holiday Program will be available in September and must be completed by October 21. See staff to request an application.

ALL ABOUT MEDICARE

New to Medicare and have questions? Don't wait and make a costly mistake! If you are struggling to know what to do, please make an appointment.

MEDICARE SAVINGS PROGRAM

If you earn under \$33,432 (single) or \$45,048 (couple) please check if you are paying the Medicare B premium (\$170.10 for 2022). If yes, please ask for an application for the Medicare Savings Program.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

Medicare Open Enrollment occurs annually from October 15 to December 7. This is an opportunity to review your current Medicare coverage and decide if you want a different plan for 2023. Please schedule an appointment for a one-on-one individualized review.

BEWARE OF SCAMS

If you receive a phone call asking for your Medicare number, do not give it out! Shared this information? Call 1-800-MEDICARE to make a fraud report.
