Please see below for frequently asked questions and the best ways to pay your tax bill.

The adjusted Real Estate and Personal Properties tax bills will be going out at the end of September 2022. They are due and payable on October 1, 2022. They will need to be paid by November 1, 2022 to avoid interest. Interest accrues from the July 1st due date at 1.5% per month or 18% per year. Minimum interest charge is \$2.00 per bill

Real Estate and Personal Property Tax bills were sent out using a temporary mill rate in July. These bills make up the difference in the increase mill rate from our approved budget.

There will be no additional billing for Motor Vehicle since the State capped the mill rate on those at 32.46.

If you do not receive a tax bill please check online through the TAX BILL LOOKUP or call our office.

Failure to receive a tax bill does not invalidate the tax or any interest charged should the tax become delinquent.

Payment Options:

Option 1: Online- Save time and pay from home and receive your receipt of payment directly to your email.

You may pay by credit card or electronic check over the internet. A nominal fee will be charged by our vendor, Invoice Cloud and is non-refundable 2.95% for credit cards & \$0.95 for an electronic check using your routing and account #'s. Credit Card/Debit Cards are not taken in the Tax Collector's Office.

Online payments will take 3-5 business days to process. The account will not show as paid online until after this processing time. Please make sure you receive a confirmation to your email that shows your payment is starting to process.

Please make sure you enter the correct account number and routing number so that the transaction does not get returned. Additional fees will be added to any payment that is returned unpaid.

Courses taught by Life Safe Services Professionals

This course is for youth's age 11 to 17 years of age with the most common age of 12 -14. This is an entry level course intended to teach age appropriate skills necessary to care for children of all ages using team babysitting, mother's helper and individual babysitting concepts. The course focuses on safety with emphasis on prevention. Other topics include hand washing, diapering, bottle feeding, personal safety and interview skills. Basic first aid and obstructed airway management for conscious choking adult/child and infant will be covered.
