#### SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH!

September 10<sup>th</sup> each year marks the peak of the Atlantic Hurricane season. While this year has been pretty quiet up until now for the northeast, down south is in clean-up mode from hurricane Idalia, which will hopefully be far off in the Atlantic by the time you receive this bulletin.

Hurricanes are only one type of disaster that we plan and prepare for in our local community. The 2023 theme for National Preparedness Month is: Take Control in 1,2,3. This campaign puts the focus on preparing older adults for disasters. We know older adults can face greater risks when it comes to extreme weather events; especially those living out in rural areas, those with disabilities, living alone and those that may be low-income. Please take the time to review the information at <u>here</u> on how you can assess your needs and some low-cost steps to become better prepared.

#### FROM THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

#### Legal Notice ASSESSOR'S NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

DECLARING PERSONAL PROPERTY: All persons liable to pay taxes are hereby notified to declare all tangible personal property owned by them on October 1, 2023. Non-residents are required to declare property located in any town for any three months preceding October 1, 2023. Assessors mail declaration forms to all property owners previously on record. Failure to receive a form does not negate the requirement to declare. Forms are available online and in the Assessor's Office. Failure to declare by November 1, 2023, will result in a 25% PENALTY assessment.

Taxable personal property includes: unregistered motor vehicles, motor vehicles located in Connecticut but registered in another state, horses and ponies, mobile manufactured homes not assessed as real estate, manufacturing machinery and equipment, business furniture and fixtures, farm machinery, farming tools, mechanics tools, electronic data processing equipment, telecommunication equipment, cables, conduits, pipes, poles, business expensed supplies and other property such as billboards, video games, vending machines, leasehold improvements, etc. Real property and Connecticut registered motor vehicles do not need to be declared.

<u>VETERANS</u> who served for ninety days or more during a time of war or have been disabled must record their honorable discharge with the Town Clerk no later than October 1, 2023, to receive a minimum of 1,000 assessment exemption. Disabled Veterans need to file proof of their VA rating with the Assessor to receive an increased exemption.

<u>ADDITIONAL VETERANS EXEMPTION</u>: Increased exemptions are available for those who meet necessary income requirements and the above Veterans criteria. An application along with proof of income must be filed with the Assessor biennially. Filings for this year must be received in the Assessor's Office no later than October 1, 2023.

<u>ARMED SERVICE MEMBERS</u> may obtain an exemption on one passenger motor vehicle by filing an application with the Assessor.

<u>TOTALLY DISABLED</u>: Any person under the age of 65, eligible to receive permanent total disability payments, must apply by January 31, 2024, to receive a 1,000 assessment exemption. Applicants must furnish proof of award.

<u>FARM MACHINERY & EQUIPMENT</u>: Eligible farmers must file the notarized exemption application no later than November 1, 2023.

<u>MANUFACTURING MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT</u> installed in a manufacturing facility and used in the manufacturing process may be allowed exemption. Eligible manufacturers must complete and file the MME Exemption Application by November 1, 2023.

<u>NEW COMMERCIAL TRUCKS</u> with a gross vehicle rating in excess of 26,000 lbs. should check with the Assessor's office for tax exemption eligibility. Applications must be completed and filed with the Assessor by November 1, 2023.

LAND CLASSIFICATION: Persons seeking to classify land under Farm, Forest or Open Space for the first time, or to amend an original filing (ownership, use or acreage) must file between September 1, 2023, and December 30, 2023, with the Assessor. The period is extended to December 30, 2023, because it is a Revaluation year. Persons applying for Forest Land classification must also have a PA490 Certified State Forester's Report dated by October 1, 2023.

Please see below for frequently asked questions and the best ways to pay your tax bill.

Delinquent tax bills have been mailed out. See payment options below on how to make your payment. Delinquent Motor Vehicle bills have been reported to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Please pay your tax bill as soon as possible to avoid having a registration held up.

It will be necessary to have all accounts paid to be able to register a vehicle. Please make sure you pay your taxes at least 2 weeks before you need to register your vehicle to make sure you have no compliance issues. You can check DMV's online services under compliance issues to ensure you are clear before you go to DMV. If you need clearance before the 2-week period of time then you will need to make your payment with a credit/debit card online or in the office. Payment can be made with cash or money order in the Tax Collector's Office as well.

Please make us aware you are requesting a release for DMV as it is not immediately taken off.

PLEASE BE ADVISED The Town of Bolton is under contract with TaxServ Capital services for the collection of some of the Towns delinquent taxes. If you receive a letter from TaxServ, you MUST call them to discuss your account and arrange payment. If you call the Tax Collector/Assessor we will direct you to Tax Serv for payment.

#### **Payment Options:**

**Option 1: Online**- Save time and pay from home and receive your receipt of payment directly to your email.

A fee of 2.50% for Credit Cards (with \$2.00 minimum), \$0.95 for E-Checks, and \$3.95 flat fee for Debit Cards will be charged by our vendor, Point and Pay, and is non-refundable.

Payments made this way will take 3-5 business days to process. The account will not show as paid online until after this processing time. Please make sure you receive confirmation to your email that shows your payment is starting to process.

Please make sure you enter the correct account number and routing number so that the transaction does not get returned. Additional fees will be added to any payment that is returned unpaid.




