SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH

Talk to your friends and family about how you will communicate before, during, and after a disaster. Make sure to update your plan based on the Centers for Disease Control recommendations due to the Coronavirus.

2. Build A Kit

Gather supplies that will last for several days after a disaster for everyone living in your home. Don't forget to consider the unique needs each person or pet may have in case you have to evacuate quickly. Update your kits and supplies based on recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control.

3. Low-Cost, No-Cost Preparedness

Natural disasters don't wait for a convenient time. Preparing for them shouldn't wait either. Start today by signing up for alerts, safe-guarding important documents, and taking other low cost and no cost preparedness actions to lessen the impact of disasters and emergencies for you and your family.

4. Teach Youth About Preparedness

Talk to your kids about preparing for emergencies and what to do in case you are separated. Reassure them by providing information about how they can get involved.

If you or a loved one are a member of the Bolton community and are medically dependent on electricity, have a medical condition or may be at risk due to disability or some other condition during an emergency please consider asking to be added to our list of at risk citizens that we check on before and after events. Please see below for frequently asked questions and the best ways to pay your tax bill.

Tax/Assessor's office will be closed from 12-1 daily

Delinquent tax bills will be mailed out soon. If you have not yet paid your taxes please check our website using the above link to find out how much is currently owed.

Delinquent Motor Vehicle bills will also be reported to the DMV and it will be necessary to have all accounts paid to be able to register a vehicle. Please make sure you pay your taxes at least 2 weeks before you need to register your vehicle to make sure you have no compliance issues. You can check DMV's online services under compliance issues to ensure you are clear before you go to DMV. If you need clearance before the 2 week period of time then you will need to make your payment online with a credit card or at the office with cash or money order as well as let me know that clearance is needed.

Paying online is not immediate and will take 3-5 days to process and post to your account.

The Board of Finance set a mill rate of 39.43 from the recently approved budget. The increase of .57 mills will be added to what is currently due. This supplemental tax amount can be paid at any time if you wish to pay in this calendar year. Otherwise, this supplemental amount due will be billed in January, 2022 for any that are still unpaid.

Motor Vehicles in which the registration expired before Oct. 1, 2020 and was not renewed until after that date will receive a tax bill in January 2022.

Payment Options:

Option 1: Online- Save time and pay from home and receive your receipt of payment directly to your email.

You may pay by credit card or electronic check over the internet. A nominal fee will be charged by our vendor, Invoice Cloud.

Option 2: In person in the lower level of Town Hall, 222 Bolton Center Rd Please add your phone number to your check so if there are any problems we can get in touch with you quickly.

Please go to the tax collector's door to the left of Town Hall. Press the button to the left of the door to be let in. You will need to wear a mask. Please be patient as we can only allow 2 people in at a time.

Option 3: Drop Slot

A drop slot to the side of the tax collector's door at Town Hall is encouraged to be used for payments. Please enclose payment in a sealed envelope addressed to the Tax Collector's office. Also, please put the best phone number to get in touch with you either on your check or the envelope.
