Zoning Sub-Committee Report (March 21, 2022)

The Zoning Sub-Committee met on Monday evening, March 21, 2022 at 5:00PM in the City Councillor Joseph A. DelGrosso City Council Chamber, Revere City Hall, 281 Broadway, Revere, MA. Committee members present were Councillors Fiore, McKenna, Novoselsky, and Visconti (ex-officio). Councillor Serino was absent.

There were two applications pending before the committee:

<u>CZ-22-01/22-062</u> Enterprise Rent-A-Car Company of Boston, LLC, 50 Tomahawk Drive, Building #49, East Boston, MA 02128 requesting the following amendment to the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 17.16.040(D) Business Uses and Consumer Services, Generally -

Table of Uses of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended by allowing Automotive/truck rental office and storage use by Special Permit^^^ in the HB District.

<u>Section 2.</u> Section 17.16.040 Generally - Table of Uses of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended by inserting the following new footnote ^^^:

- 1. Allowed vehicles as part of the "Automotive/truck rental office and storage" shall be limited to no more than a GVW 8,000 lb limit.
- 2. Vehicle capacity shall be limited to up to 50 rental vehicles on site at any one time.
- 3. There shall be a minimum lot size of 25,000 square feet for any property seeking such a use by Special Permit.
- 4. No stacking of vehicles will be allowed on site.
- 5. No repair, maintenance, or body work shall be allowed on site.
- 6. Applicants must agree to install and provide substantive screening and buffering on site.

Nick Zozula, Attorney for the applicant addressed the Zoning Sub-Committee on his client's request for the proposed zoning amendment. Attorney Zozula submitted a packet of materials dated March 8, 2022 in response to the City Council public hearing clarifying issues and concerns that were raised. The materials were accepted and made part of the record.

Councillor Visconti questioned the amount of estimated excise tax that Enterprise would pay. Based on the number of vehicles and the annual excise tax amount, the number provided seems to be in excess. Additionally, the \$10.00 surcharge per transaction ceases when the public safety facility loan has been paid off. In Councillor Visconti's opinion, he does not want to see the Squire Road area opened up for this type of proposed use.

Councillor Fiore questioned that if the zoning change were to be implemented and a special permit was granted who be responsible for enforcing the conditions of the special permit. The City Clerk replied that the Building Inspector, not the City Council, enforces the special permit.

Councillor Novoselsky would like to include a condition that excludes park and fly businesses in the HB District.

Councillor Cogliandro is in favor of the proposed use as this area of Squire Road has been vacant for some time. He would rather see some business operate at this location rather than an empty lot.

Councillor McKenna and Keefe would like to see the highest and best use for Squire Road and rental car facilities do not fit in with their vision.

Councillor Fiore requested that the zoning amendment remain in committee for further discussion. Chairman Keefe agreed and scheduled a follow-up Zoning Sub-Committee for April 11, 2022 at 5:00PM.

<u>C-22-01/22-063</u> Broadway Capital CDPM, Inc., 932 Broadway, Unit 1, Chelsea, MA 02150, requesting a special permit from the Revere City Council for the extension and alteration of a nonconforming structure and use to enable the appellant to

convert a former nursing home to a 72 unit mixed use development consisting of 71 residential units and 1 office at 133 Salem Street, Revere, MA 02151.

Mikael Vienneau, Broadway Capital addressed the Zoning Sub-Committee. He gave a presentation and reviewed the traffic study with the committee members. Both documents were filed and made part of the record. After holding a neighborhood meeting with abutters, he felt that most of the concerns that were raised at the initial public hearing have been addressed. Mr. Vienneau indicated that of the 71 residential units he has committed to designating 2 of those units as affordable units with preference to Revere residents or military. However, Chairman Keefe would like to see at least 10% of the proposed units be dedicated as affordable housing.

Ward Six Councillor Serino was unable to attend this evening's committee meeting due to illness. Alternatively, he submitted a letter which was read and made part of the record.

Resident George Wolfe, 109 Salem Street, again expressed his concerns that there will be too much traffic generated from the proposal, especially backing up onto Waitt Park. Overall, he believes the project is too large and would like to see less units which mirrors Councillor Fiore's opinion. Mr. Wolfe also cited concerns over public bike path access.

Chairman Keefe requested that the applicant work on the number of affordable housing units and address concerns around traffic and bike path access for the next meeting of the Zoning Sub-Committee to be held on April 11, 2022 at 5:00PM.

Ways & Means Sub-Committee Report

The Ways & Means Sub-Committee met on Monday evening, March 28, 2022 at 5:00PM. Committee members present were Councillors Fiore, Keefe, Serino, Visconti (ex-offcio), and Chairman Rizzo were present. Councillor Novoselsky was absent.

Councillor Fiore indicated that the water rate could come down if certain items were not funded through the Enterprise fund such as employees, vehicles, clothing, etc. He further stated that the

rate the MWRA charges the City is less than what the City charges the ratepayers.

Councillors Keefe, McKenna, Serino, and Visconti all spoke in favor of the ordinance as many of the folks affected are long time home-owners in the City and have been paying the residential water for decades. Councillor Visconti did reiterate that whatever the Council decides, the redistribution of the water rates will affect all properties.

Rich Viscay, CFO also addressed the committee on this request.

After hearing testimony and receiving a rough estimate of the number of 4-6 unit owner-occupied structures, Councillor Keefe offered an amendment to include 5 and 6 unit owner-occupied structures. Councillors Fiore, Keefe, Serino, Visconti (ex-offcio), and Chairman Rizzo voting in the affirmative.

The ordinance as amended will now remain in committee for the purpose of gathering additional information on how the City can best redistribute the water rates.

Several Councillors were not in favor of this motion citing that paying by credit card is a choice, most residents using credit cards do so to earn points, regular businesses are subject to the same credit card fees, and the City should not be responsible for paying the fee if the taxpayer chooses to use a credit card. If the City absorbs the cost through the budget, it is not fair for taxpayers who do not use credit cards.

Rich Viscay, CFO addressed the committee on this motion. He indicated that the City cannot lower taxpayers' obligations in order to absorb the fees. The fees are charged by the credit card companies, not the City.

Councillor Fiore requested that the Mayor and City Solicitor address the Council on this motion, not the CFO.

The motion did not receive a favorable recommendation from the Committee. Councillor Fiore and Chairman Rizzo voting "YES". Councillors Keefe, Novoselsky, Serino, and Council President Visconti voting "NO".

I. AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING TITLE 12 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF REVERE.

SECTION 1. Title 12 of the Revised Ordinances of the city of Revere is hereby amended by inserting the following new chapter and sections:

Chapter 12.18 - DRAIN LAYERS

12.18.010 – Definition.

"Drain layer" is a general term applied to a licensed professional, engaged in the business of installing sanitary sewer pipes, water distribution pipes, stormwater pipes, natural gas pipes, electric conduit, including geotechnical subsurface exploration, and any/all underground and subsurface utilities. Such utilities include main line pipes as well as public or private service line pipes, and all related connections and appurtenances.

12.18.020 – Approval; applications; licensing.

- A. Consistent with chapter 13.08, all drain layers must be licensed and/or approved by the director of public works and the city engineer prior to commencing any work within the city of Revere. The director of public works and the city engineer may license such drain layers as apply and are found competent. No person other than a licensed drain layer shall construct, repair, otherwise connect to or excavate for such purpose any utility within the City's right of way nor perform any type of subsurface exploration and/or boring of any kind.
- B. All applications for the construction, repair, or alteration of utilities for private use within the City's right of way, and their entrance into common utilities, shall be made to the director of public works, and shall be in such form as he/she shall prescribe, and shall be approved by the city engineer. All such utilities for private use within the City's right of way and their entrances into common utility systems shall be constructed, connected, maintained, and kept in repair by a licensed private drain layer hired or employed by the applicant in such manner as the director of public works and/or city engineer may from time to time determine. The cost of any work so constructed, maintained, or repaired shall be paid by the applicant therefor.







3. Public Utilities:

After performing a simple review of the utilities, a summary of our findings and recommendations is outlined below:

The electrical service will be provided by National Grid. The current service will need to be upgraded existing service to a 1600-amp 3-phase service in order provide adequate electrical capacity for the 72 units. The line will enter the property via Salem Street side of property.

The domestic water, sewer and sprinkler lines will most likely be adequate to support the demands for the 72 units. The current building has a 4-inch domestic water line, 6-inch dedicated sprinkler line and 6-inch sewer main. Pending results of hydrant flow test, we may need to make modification to these systems.

The new building will be required to have an updated fire alarm control panel with multiple zones. The system will consist of at least one fire pull stations, heat detectors in unit entrances, smoke detectors in common areas and horn/strobes in common areas. With the change in use, the life safety systems will need to be upgraded to meet current local fire and building code requirements.

The building will be fully sprinklered with a new fire protection system. There will be one dedicated fire service throughout the building. One 6-inch service line currently enter from Salem Street with a new circulation pump. All sprinkler heads will be residential or quick response type.

The storm water runoff will be capture through 6-8 roof drains (per building) and tie-in will be done via a dedicated line on Salem Street. Based on preliminary

analysis, the current rainwater drainage system will be sufficient for this residential development.

4. Neighborhood Impact: Adequate off-street parking spots with minimal impact to neighborhood

Minimal changes to traffic flow patterns as vehicles will enter onto both Salem

Street and Waitt Park (existing condition)




Locus Map from City of Revere GIS System:
