AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF REVERE RELATIVE TO THE REGULATION OF FIREWORKS

Be it ordained by the City of Revere, MA as follows:

Section 1. Section 8.16.200 Aerial Fireworks of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended by deleting the section in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the following new section:

Section 8.16.200 Aerial Fireworks

- A. No person shall have in their possession, or use, or explode, or cause to explode, any combustible or explosive composition or substance, or any combination of such compositions or substances, or any other article, including fireworks, which was prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration, or detonation within the city limits of the City of Revere unless they are permitted to do so by express approval of the Revere Fire Department.
- B. For the purposes of this chapter the word "fireworks" shall include compositions, substances or other articles and shall also include blank cartridges or toy cannons in which explosives are used, the type of toy balloon which requires fire underneath to propel the same, firecrackers, cherry bombs, silver salutes, M–80's, torpedoes, skyrockets, Roman candles, rockets, wheels, colored fires, fountains, mines, serpents, or other fireworks of like construction or any fireworks containing any explosive or flammable compound, or any tablets or other device containing any explosive substance.
- C. Whoever shall have in their possession or under their control, or whoever shall use or explode or cause to explode any fireworks in violation of this chapter shall be punished by a civil fine of: not less than fifty dollars for the first offense, not less than one hundred dollars for the second offense, and not less than one hundred and fifty dollars for subsequent offenses. Any officer qualified to serve criminal process shall issue a civil fine in accordance with the section of this chapter and shall seize all of the fireworks mentioned herein without a warrant. The fireworks seized shall, upon conviction of such violation, be forfeited to the Commonwealth.
- D. Notice of such seizure of the fireworks shall immediately be sent to the marshal by the officer making the seizure, and the fireworks seized shall be held and securely stored by the Revere Police Department until the marshal or their authorized representative takes them into their possession for disposal.

Section 2. Section 8.16.210 Violations- Notice before action is hereby amended by inserting "Section 8.16.200" after "Section 8.16.080."

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF REVERE AND

REVERE CROSSING GUARDS' UNION AFSCME COUNCIL 93, LOCAL 880 A

The City of Revere and Revere Crossing Guards Union, AFSCME Council 93, Local 880 agree to the following for an agreement for the period 7/1/23 to 6/30/26.

Article XVI

Holidays

Effective July 1, 2023, members of the bargaining unit who satisfy the following requirements shall be paid for the following six (6) Holidays:

Thanksgiving Day

Juneteenth

Day after Thanksgiving

Martin Luther King

· New Year's Day

Memorial Day

In order to be paid for any of the above Holidays, the employee must work the scheduled workday immediately before the Holiday and the scheduled workday immediately succeeding the Holiday.

Vacation

Effective July 1, 2023, members of the bargaining unit who have been employed as of 7/1/23 shall be provided with two (2) weeks of paid vacation for the February and April school vacation weeks. The amount of the payment shall be the average weekly wage paid to the employee during the previous six (6) weeks.

Article XVII

Compensation

Section 1

Members of the bargaining unit in the listed classifications shall be compensated at the following rates, effective as of the dates specified:

The parties agree that in consideration for this Agreement, this Contract and its wage provisions are expressly exempt from the Living Wage Ordinance set forth in Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere, Title 15, Chapter 15.17. These are part-time positions, which means no more than 19.5 hours per week. Lastly, the Traffic/Crossing Guard Lead Supervisor positions are up to two (2).

Section 2

Adjust the table in section 2 to add an 8 year step and a 17 year step as follows:

Section 3 - Supervisor Cell Phone

Effective July 1, 2023, the City agrees to a monthly stipend in the amount of \$45.00/monthly to be paid to the Traffic/Crossing Guard Lead Supervisor as compensation for using their personal cell phone to conduct City business.

Section 5 - Uniforms

Effective July 1, 2023, the annual clothing allowance will increase to \$700 from \$600 with two installments of \$350.

Section 6 - Retention Bonus

Only for FY24, returning crossing guards will receive a \$500 dollars retention bonus in-lieu of retro payment. This will only apply upon signing a "letter of Intention" to return.

Article XIX

Duration

This Agreement shall be effective as of July 1, 2023, and continue in full force and effect until June 30, 2026. Any form of compensation in this Agreement is effective and retroactive to July 1, 2023.

The Parties agree to work together to produce a fully integrated contract within 60 days of the ratification of the agreement by both Parties.
