Motions

- 12. 19-242 Motion presented by Councillor Rotondo: That the Mayor request the State Police and or State Auditor to investigate the policy and procedure regarding the release of information from the Revere Police Department, in particular the release of a domestic event involving my children on October 2, 2012 in which Officer Soto and Duca were involved. The information was released on September 16, 2019in an apparent attempt to discredit me publicly. I demand answer and I demand an investigation from an outside agency. If this can be done to a public official involving my children then it could be done to any member of the public.
- 13. <u>19-243</u> Motion presented by Councillor Rotondo: That the City Council refer to a public hearing the attached proposed ordinance relative to the regulation of food trucks.
- 14. 19-244 Motion presented by Councillor McKenna: That the Mayor request Comcast and RCN to coordinate the removal of existing cable wires when new installations take place. As example, there are several instances throughout Ward 1 where RCN cuts the old Comcast cable and internet wires and simply wraps the wires around the telephone poles.
- Motion presented by Councillor McKenna: That the Mayor request the construction companies responsible for closing portions of the Ocean Avenue sidewalk to create a pedestrian walkway while construction is in progress. Pedestrians currently have to walk on Ocean Avenue and this is a public safety hazard. This work should be fulfilled by the winter months in order to accommodate commuters walking to the train station.
- Motion presented by Council President Guinasso: That the Mayor be requested to notify National Grid of the City's opposition to National Grid performing non-emergency utility work during the evening hours with the use of generators and to direct National Grid not to perform such work. The sound produced by generators during the evening hours is a direct violation and the City's noise ordinance and will create a nuisance for abutting residents near these proposed non-emergency work sites.

17.	<u>19-247</u>	Motion presented by Councillor Giannino: That the Mayor look into the feasibility of purchasing a generator for the DPW. With the winter months coming up the DPW offices must have power.
18.	<u>19-248</u>	Motion presented by Councillor Rotondo: That the Revere City Council, under the auspices of the City Solicitor, draft an ordinance that will make residency fraud a finable offense up to \$300. Likewise, that the City of Revere rest these powers within the domain of the Police Department, truant officers, or their designee.
19.	<u>19-249</u>	Motion presented by Councillor Rotondo: That the Mayor provide the City Council with a list of hearing officers for the various departments within the city. Furthermore, under what framework and what law do they operate?
20.	<u>19-250</u>	Motion presented by Councillor McKenna, Councillor Novoselsky: That the Mayor request Veterans Services to adopt a Veteran Pinning Ceremony to honor living elderly veterans that have served in WWII, Vietnam, and or Korean Wars. Please see attached policy.
21.	<u>19-251</u>	Motion presented by Councillor Patch: That the Mayor request the Traffic Commission to install an electronic speed reader sign on the west bound side of Sargent Street heading towards Washington Avenue. There is only a speed reader installed on the east bound side.
22.	<u>19-252</u>	Motion presented by Councillor Morabito: That the City Council award a Certificate of Commendation to Sgt. Chris Giannino in recognition of protecting and serving the City of Revere for 30 years on the Revere Police Department.
