Item #2: Guest Speaker- Revere Police Chief David Callahan will join us to speak about CIT training that is done in the department.

Chief Callahan spoke on CIT (Crisis Intervention Training); focus on de-escalation tactics. This is utilized in many surrounding communities and was started in Somerville about 15 years ago. RPD has about 85% of officers trained (Which entailed a 5 day/ 40-hour course) If anyone is interested in learning about the program the website is :

<u>https://www.metrobostoncit.org/new-page-5</u>. They learned what not to do or say which is helpful with persons with Mental Health Issues/ASD or Disabled. CIT uses a group approach, having law enforcement /MH workers and addiction specialists working together, This will move mentally ill people away for police/courts and bring them to health care facilities and practitioners. CTI is useful in deescalating situations and bring down injuries both for the police officers and the persons. Training focuses on how not to trigger along with teaching officers on how to stay calm. The goal is to train the entire department. Chief Callahan wrapped up with saying 1 emotional support dog and are looking for funding for a second. There are Officers in Revere who speak different languages, which is a benefit in our community. They also utilize Google translate if there is not an officer on site until one can get there.

The City of Boston mentioned they have a program called the BEST team and it is part of their safety response team. They also mentioned they work with Boston Medical center as part of this program.
- 3. The Disability Commission member from Newburyport discussed a local business owner who is planning to rehab a building to open a new restaurant but wants to have a second floor and not put in an elevator. This would need a variance from the AAB and the Commission is highly against it.
