Water & Sewer Improvement Project Overview

The City of Revere (City) and its consultants have identified improvements to the aging infrastructure crossing beneath the MBTA railroad tracks on Bridge Street/Oak Island Road and the immediately adjacent areas that are necessary to provide continued delivery of reliable water and sewer utility service to the Oak Island neighborhood. The project is scheduled to begin **IMMEDIATELY**, in order to take advantage of the MBTA's previously scheduled shutdown of the commuter rail line. By aligning this work, we avoid an additional shutdown. A map depicting the approximate location of these infrastructure improvements is provided.

The work will consist of removing and replacing approximately 600 linear feet of aging water main and 115 linear feet of aging sewer, as well as installing approximately 430 linear feet of redundant water main to improve resiliency.

Residents are advised to park their vehicles on the east side of the tracks, when possible, to avoid access issues.

Access in and out of the Oak Island Neighborhood west of the Railroad Crossing will be limited during the week long shutdown: April 20, through April 28, 2024

Residents will have daily access to cross the MBTA rail corridor by vehicle between: 7:00 – 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 – 6:00 p.m.

*Outside of these time frames, vehicles will have to comply with the direction of the police details on-site.
