

Job Title: Youth Career Pathway Instructor: Public Art Department: Community Development Location: Location may vary throughout Revere Hours: Variable up to 25 hours per week, may include nights and weekends Salary: \$30 per hour, this is a temporary non-union position

Description: The Youth Career Pathway Instructor for Public Art will lead a cohort of 5-6 youth involved in the youth summer job program. This is a new, temporary position created to expand the types of employment opportunities available for Revere youth beyond traditional office job environments. The specific focus on public art will allow youth to safely express their creativity, while engaging and bringing community together and enhancing public spaces. The instructor will be responsible for developing a curriculum and leading the day-to-day activities with the youth. Most of the lesson planning and curriculum development is expected to occur in June before the summer job program begins and it is anticipated that this position will oversee youth for an average of 20 hours a week, with an additional 5 hours available for ongoing lesson planning, during July and August 2022.

Desired Outcomes:

- Youth will gain an understanding of the public art process, various types of public art, and related career paths
- Youth will have an opportunity for hands-on creative expression
- Youth will feel empowered to participate, regardless of their skill level or art-making experience
- Youth will engage in the creative process and collaborate with peers and instructor on brainstorming and execution of projects
- City spaces will be activated by temporary art displays
- Complete 2-4 projects, depending on scope and logistics
- Projects could range from painted surfaces to stand-alone 3D objects to installations and site activations

Responsibilities:

- Curriculum development, consisting of both hands-on art creation, through initial project development and design, community engagement, art creation and installation, and additional educational opportunities through site visits and guest speakers.
- Develop supply list and navigate approval process for all materials with the Dept of Planning and Community Development
- Work with relevant departments/bodies on site selection
- Engage students in all levels of project development, from concept to completion
- Ensure project stays on track and within determined budget
- Communicate and collaborate with other City departments as needed
- Lead community engagement efforts
- Recruit guest speakers and arrange site visits
- Develop and submit reports as requested
- Create an equitable space for all youth involved in this program

Qualifications:

- 2+ years of relevant experience and overall comfort working with youth and young adults ages 16-21
- Background in art administration, community development or related field; specific experience in managing public art projects
- Strong problem solving and interpersonal skills
- Familiarity with municipal functions, including the Public Art Commission, is a plus
- Demonstrated cultural competency, experience working with diverse communities
- Ability to manage project budgets, report on project deliverables
- Related experience with classroom instruction and group facilitation
- Means of transportation to visit worksites, pick up supplies
- Must pass CORI/SORI
