# **ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW THIS FALL ABOUT...**



## TIMELY WATER TIPS FROM THE EXPERTS AT GAUD.

With more than a century of experience, the Greater Augusta Utility District has learned a lot about how to manage water effectively. These tips can help you conserve water, save money on your GAUD bills, and prevent seasonal problems.

### SAVE WATER, AND SAVE ON YOUR BILLS!

- 1. Fix toilet leaks. (This is the biggest water waster in the average household.) Or, if it's time, get a new toilet-it can use 75% less water than an old one.
- 2. Take a shower instead of a bath. using a low-flow shower head. An average full bath uses 60 gallons of water; a guick shower only a fraction of that-and a low-flow head can cut use by another 40%.
- 3. Wait till vou have a full load to do laundry or use your dishwasher. Two half loads use twice as much water as one full load!
- 4. Over-seed your lawn this fall with ryes and fescues to thicken-up your grass. This will help reduce the amount of water your lawn needs next spring.



### **GET YOUR PIPES** READY FOR WINTER.

- 1. Be sure your water meter and pipes are located in a warm, dry, and accessible area. Check for broken windows or damaged skirting that might cause freezing.
- 2. Protect outside pipes and faucets. If you have a separate shutoff valve, turn it off and drain the pipes. If not, insulate outside faucets and hose bibs. You should also strongly consider re-routing any outdoor pipes.
- 3. Caulk around pipes where they enter the house. Seal cracks or holes in windows, walls or doors near the meter or pipes.
- 4. Leave doors open to cabinets with plumbing inside to make sure heat gets to the pipes.
- 5. Insulate pipes in an unheated garage, basement or crawl space with foam tubes or wrap.
- 6. Locate your shutoff valves. and try using them now to make sure they're working in case of an emergency.

#### **KEEP YOUR BASEMENT DRY.**



Be sure to seal window wells and fix leaks in basement walls.

- 2. Disconnecting downspouts from the sewer system will also help prevent basement flooding and the release of polluted rainwater into local waterways.
- 3. Consider installing a sump pump if you have experienced basement flooding-and be sure to maintain your equipment once it's installed.

Please do not hook sump pumps up to the sewer system. To do so is a violation of our sewer use ordinance.
