Since then, for 170 years, Poland Spring has been one of the many original Maine identifiers that make this State so wonderful. Along with other Franklin County-born treasures, such as the earmuffs that are known across the globe and first created by Chester Greenwood, Poland Spring is also world-renowned for being some of the best-tasting natural spring water ever. The company was even comedically referred to by the classic 90's television show *Seinfield*!

Since 2000, Poland Spring has allocated approximately 7 million dollars to local Maine community organizations, causes and events through their *Good Neighbor Grant* program. I asked Tom what it meant for Poland Spring to be recognized for the efforts giving back. "Our donations and efforts to give back are not purely done for recognition," says Tom. "Rather, we want to build a legacy and formulate a tradition surrounding community involvement. So when people think of Poland Spring, they don't just think of it as a bottled water company, but a company that gives back what the community, and the nation, so graciously puts in."
