Each year United Way seeks nominations from the community to recognize an individual, organization, business, or couple that has gone above and beyond to positively impact Greater Franklin County through volunteer efforts. This is done in honor of Gary A. LaGrange and is called the Gary A. LaGrange Community Impact Award. This award is given annually to a business, organization, or individual who has gone above and beyond to impact Greater Franklin County through volunteerism. Seven nominations were carefully reviewed by the United Way Board and then scored. This year, United Way was pleased to honor Katie Hallman Brackett. As a public-school nurse Katie Hallman, works primarily with Pre-K and elementary-age children at Mallett School in Farmington. Katie is known for jumping to the aid of thousands of children over her career who have food insecurities, injuries, disabilities, and illness. Katie has offered countless education-based opportunities for families, such as training for proper usage of Epi-pens, seizure management, and other on-site supports for parents and grandparents. She has procured grant funding to purchase Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) for children and staff experiencing life-threatening heart problems. Katie is also heavily involved in the Girl's State program, influencing the lives of an estimated forty to fifty local young women over the years.

To be nominated for this award is a great honor and requires a significant focus on volunteerism and your community. United Way also recognizes those whose names were submitted for consideration and thanks them for all they do. Congratulations.
