Visiting Swaziland/Eswatini

We have a change to make you aware of. Last year during the 50th celebration of Swaziland's independence, and his 50th birthday celebration, King Mswatii III announced that he was changing the name Kingdom of Swaziland to "Kingdom of eSwatini" (or Eswatini - both spellings are correct.) Our website and materials have been updated to reflect this change.

Our team arrived in Eswatini on Monday, July 29 and stayed until Sat. Aug. 3. This year we flew right into the airport in Manzini to save time in traveling from Johannesburg, South Africa. We stayed in a guest house on the Emmanuel Bible College campus which was greatly appreciated and just the right size for our team of two.

On Tuesday, we drove to the Ebenezer Feeding Station. We had new children to see there that are attending the preschool and receiving a daily meal. We also had been asked to add some children who are being seen monthly at the Ebenezer Clinic for HIV treatment. Some of these children live a distance from the feeding station and so are not able to get there for meals. They are desperate for food. It is essential that they have substantial food to take their antiretroviral medications; otherwise, they become ill and want to stop treatment. Sponsorship of these children will help provide food for them, making their HIV treatment more successful.

Due to the fact that the road conditions are very bad and travel time took longer than expected, that we added new children from the feeding station, and added new children from the clinic, we were not able to update as many school children as we had planned. We will be looking at a way to spend more time in this community next year so we can see all the students we need to.

On Wednesday we visited the Ngcina community. Since Kris was training to become a coordinator, she had a chance to interview the children there while I took the measurements and photographs. Little did we know at that time that she would be taking over the South Africa program which we would be visiting the following week.

Between the two feeding stations, the associated schools, and the Children's Home, we interviewed and documented a total of 83 children. We are happy to report that all children in the Children's Home have sponsors. There may be a new boy joining the home, but he is not there yet.0

Why is sponsorship important?

As mentioned previously, food is desperately needed. Sponsorship will help provide food as well as provide for educational needs of our students. With poor nutrition, a child's brain will not be able to function or learn as effectively as a child who is wellnourished.

Another need is school uniforms. These are very expensive and difficult to afford, yet they are mandatory. Over the last year, we were able to give two special donations to purchase uniforms for those students who were extremely needy and who didn't have a sponsor to help cover the cost. Children at both Ebenezer and Ngcina were thrilled to receive new shoes and at least part of a uniform. There are still many more who need a uniform. Sponsorship will help them,

Sponsorships for both schoolaged students and those attending the feeding stations are \$20 per month. Sponsorships for children living at the Children's Home is \$30 a month, for either a school or a home sponsorship.

Prayer Needs

- That our sphere of influence will increase.

- Our partner, Thabsile, needs medical insurance. Pray that this need will be met. If you are interested in knowing how to help, please contact me at the address below.

- Pray for a team to go to Eswatini in July 2020. We need only three to four people to make a team. Having an interviewer, someone to measure, and a photographer is ideal. Perhaps you are being called! Plan now to start saving and finding supporters!
