Freshman Field Experience- Earth Science Class



In May, all freshman earth science classes took a field trip to Farmington Falls to experience, in real life, many of the concepts they had been learning about in class. In particular, they were practicing using evidence they found in the field to support hypotheses about the geologic formation of Maine. They were also able to witness first-hand examples of erosion, transport and deposition by the Sandy River, and learn the basics of predicting weather.
