Purpose:

This award has been created to provide financial support for one Mt. Blue High School senior who is enrolled in an **education degree** at a college or university.

Award Criteria:

- 1. Must be a graduating Mt. Blue senior.
- 2. Must have been accepted into a college or university in the field of education.
- 3. Must have maintained a high school GPA of 80 or higher.
- 4. Must submit a 500 word essay stating why he/she desires to enter the field of education. This essay will be judged for clarity of purpose and writing conventions.
- 5. Applications must be submitted to the High School Registrar by April 15th

Process:

- The application will be provided by the association through the School Counseling Office at Mt. Blue High School via their webpage and Scholarship link.
- Recipients will be chosen by the Administrators' Association Awards Committee on the established award criteria.
- One award will be granted and announced at the MBHS Senior Scholarship night.
- The Association's treasurer will distribute the awards after the completion of the recipient's first semester provided the recipient demonstrates a GPA of 3.0 or higher during the first semester. If the recipient fails to meet the GPA standard the award will be withdrawn.
